Ahh...Christmas. A time of joy and peace in the celebration of the only begotten Son sent from the Father. This is a very busy time of year in the EB Church of Akko. One of our favorite things to do is to visit of the homes of the church members and also some homes in the communities of Akko and the surrounding villages. From December 13th - 23rd we brought the gift of celebration in song, a word of encouragement and time of prayer and blessing for the families and their homes. It was a joyous time not only for each family, but it was also an encouragement to us and the people in the church, as they heard testimony relating to this in our meetings.

Recently, we had an offer from the Nazareth Bible College to train 3 people from our congregation free of charge. For attending the Bible College they will receive a 4 year Bachelors degree. This will start in February. Also we are looking forward to Wednesdays in February, when the College will be sending a professor to teach our members a course in systematic theology, "Who was Jesus".

On the 24th of December we had a special meeting where we read Christmas stories and sang songs.

On the 27th of December we had a visiting choir called, "Melody of Peace". Brother Fadi spoke an encouraging message. They also presented a wonderful puppet show for us. In one of the skits the puppets were joking about, what they call, the feasts. "What party are you going to? What gift are you bringing?" Then they found out what the gift really is, the gift of God that Jesus brought.

On the 31st of December, Pastor Harry and Fibi came to visit. Fibi gave a testimony about how she had been a Muslim and how during that time she had suffered very much. Her suffering continued until she met Jesus and Jesus set her free. There were 7 Muslim people visiting the Church that evening and they were very much encouraged by her testimony.

And finally, on the 2nd of January, we had our annual Christmas party at the church. There was a wonderful dinner prepared for us, and afterwards we enjoyed a time of games and Bible quote competitions.
